Athletic Training is an exciting and expanding profession, which offers opportunities for those interested in a health care career working with athletes and those who are physically active.

Certified Athletic Trainers (ATC) are highly qualified, allied health care professionals who specialize in preventing, recognizing, managing and rehabilitating injuries that result from physical activity. Why? To allow the injured individual to return to competition, work, or play as quickly and safely as possible.

As part of a complete health care team, the certified athletic trainer works under the direction of a licensed physician and in cooperation with other health care professionals, athletic administrators, coaches and parents.

Certified Athletic Trainers have employment opportunities in settings such as:

- Industrial settings
- Professional programs
- Military/Law Enforcement
