## CALL FOR ARTISTS

### THE CONFERENCE

Virginia Woolf (1882-1941) was an English writer known for her narrative innovation and her prolific literary output: novels, short stories, sketches, memoirs, biographies, letters, diary entries, and hundreds of essays. She was also known for her groundbreaking feminist ideals and political awareness. The Annual International Conference on Virginia Woolf has been held at various locations worldwide and provides an opportunity for the study and celebration of the great writer. Conference attendees include high school teachers, undergraduate and graduate students, independent scholars, professors, and general readers. This year's conference, with the theme Virginia Woolf and the Natural World, will be held at Georgetown College in Georgetown, Kentucky, from June 3-6, 2010. In order to allow attendees to experience Woolf in a visual manner, the Georgetown College Art Galleries will be curating an exhibition related to the conference. The show will be on display from May 13-June 10, 2010.

### THE CALL

All artists are invited to submit original works of any media related to the conference theme. Submissions may take inspiration from the following excerpt:

*"Sharp stripes of shadow lay on the grass, and the dew dancing on the tips of the flowers and leaves made the garden like a mosaic of single sparks not yet formed into one whole. The birds, whose breasts were specked canary and rose, now sang a strain or two together, wildly, like skaters rollicking arm-in-arm, and were suddenly silent, breaking asunder."*

All submissions should include the following:

- Letter of interest
- Résumé
- Artist's statement
- Wall text for each submission
- Installation instructions, if applicable
- CD or DVD, labeled with artist name, with submission images
  - Must be in JPEG format
  - 300 dpi, 4"x6"
  - Each image should be labeled as: last name, title of work.jpg
  - Must be MAC compatible

Please note that unselected submission materials will only be returned if a SASE is included with the original submission. All submissions should be sent to the following address:

### DEADLINES

All submission proposals must be postmarked by January 1, 2010. Artists will be notified of the committee's decision by March 1, 2010. All selected works must be delivered to the Georgetown College Art Department by April 16, 2010 and must be on display for the duration of the show. All shipping/delivery costs are the responsibility of the artist.
